On tuesday 23, 2022, The President of the Republic His Excellency Evariste NDAYISHIMIYE received in audience at the Ntare Rushatsi Palace, the Secretary General of the EAC Honorable Peter MA-THUKI, with whom they discussed the priority projects of the Community and their rapid execution. The President of the Republic first congratulated the countries of the sub-

region for the success of the free and peaceful elections, including Uganda and Kenya, before expressing his wish to do the same for the DRC next year, 2023 to recover peace and security because this will thus allow the Community to tackle only development projects through a free movement of goods and people in the sub -region.

These personalities insisted on projects related to infrastructure such as the railway and the roads linking different regions of the countries of the Community, the Youth Summit which will be held in December 2022 and which will bring together more than 20,000 young people with the aim to promote their effective integration into the Community, the exploitation of Lake Tanganyika, and the consideration of French and Kiswahili as official languages of the EAC.

The Secretary General of the EAC expressed his satisfaction with the good advice given to him by the current President of the EAC, before reporting his frequency in Burundi, to recharge his batteries. (www.presidence.bi)

On tuesday, august 22, 2022, the First Lady of Burundi Her Excellency Angeline NDAYISHIMIYE received in audience the Secretary General of the EAC Mr. Mathuki Peter Mutuku at the headquarters of the OPDD in Bujumbura.

At the end of the interview, the General Secretariat of the EAC Mr. Peter MATHUKI told the press that he had come to discuss with the First Lady of Burundi HE Angeline NDAYISHIMIYE on the organization of a forum of First Ladies and other women leaders from EAC member countries.

This forum, which will be the first of its kind in the region, will focus on the challenges of maternal and child health, how to contribute to the development of the women's sector as well as the empowerment and well-being of young people. This forum will be organized soon by mutual agreement between the General Secretariat of the EAC and the Office of the First Lady for Development OPDD, according to the Executive Secretary of the OPDD.

The Secretary General of the EAC congratulated the First Lady of Burundi for

the actions already carried out and in progress and encouraged her to contribute to the development of these different sectors at the community level.

First Lady Angeline NDAYISHIMIYE also announced that Burundi and Zimbabwe are in the running to host the ceremonies marking the 20th anniversary of OPDAD. CNS: Burundi pledges to contribute to peace in South Kivu



n monday august 22, 2022, the National Security Council (CNS) met in its extraordinary session, , under the chairmanship of the Head of State, Supreme Commander of the Defense and Security Forces and President of the said Council. At the end of the council, the Permanent Secretary of the CNS Pierre Claver NZISABI-RA issued a press release in which he indicated that during this session, the members of the Council analyzed the security situation prevailing throughout the country in terms of multisectoral.

Council noted with satisfaction that security prevails throughout the territory. After reviewing general safety issues, the CNS communicates the following: On the military level: The security of the eastern region of the Democratic Republic of Congo caught the attention of the participants.

Indeed, since the solemn entry of the Democratic Republic of Congo into the East African Community, security in this country and neighboring countries has been a priority for Heads of State during the various conclaves held in Nairobi. The Heads of State have decided to send a regional armed force to the Democratic Republic of Congo to hunt down all the terrorist groups that disturb the security of this country, including Burundians.

It is in this sense that, within the framework of a bilateral agreement with the DRC, Burundi will deploy a contingent to track down these evil forces present in South Kivu who continue to disrupt security in Burundi, pending the effective deployment of this regional force.

It should be noted that the Constitution of Burundi grants the President of the Republic, under circumstances and conditions that it specifies, to use armed force, including the sending of troops outside the country.

The CNS calls to order Burundian citizens who believe in the media that disseminate false and inflammatory information to come to their senses and trust

the administrative authorities because the responsible Government is the guarantor of security for all.

In addition, the CNS calls, once again, the Burundians, and especially the youth, refugees in the Mahama and Nakivale camps to return home without delay, where their brothers and sisters await them with open arms.

On the economic level: at a time when the economy of the world has been shaken lately by the Covid-19 pandemic and the war between Russia and Ukraine, the countries of the world, including Burundi, are suffering the consequences of these evils.

The shortage of petroleum products as well as the soaring prices on the world market affect the world's populations. The council wishes to reassure the Burundian citizens that there is a glimmer of hope, that it just takes patience because the machine is in motion and that a lasting solution will not be long in coming.

The council noted with satisfaction that where the administration endorses the management of products subject to current speculation, namely sugar, fuel, cement as well as Brarudi products, the situation is tolerable and the complaints of the population are less.

The council reviewed the information in lieu of a regional alert on a famine that has already declared itself in Uganda, Eritrea, and Ethiopia. On this point, the council recommends that Burundians make good harvest management and redouble their efforts, particularly in the cultivation of marshes and in the largescale irrigation of dry lands.
