n wednesday september 28, 2022, while she was received in audience, at the Presidential Office Ntare Rushatsi by the President of Burundi His Excellency Evariste NDAYISHIMIYE, a delegation from the International Monetary Fund led by Mrs. Mame Astou Diouf, in charge of the Africa Department within the said fund affirms the latter's commitment to support Burundi in improving macroeconomic policy.

During this audience, discussions also focused on the state of relations between Burundi and the IMF. Mrs. Mame Astou Diouf reveals a financial commitment from the IMF to support the Burundian Government in its effort to reform macroeconomic policy in order to be able to adapt it to the context of the country, which will al-

low stability and economic development.

For his part, the President of the Republic welcomed this manifest commitment of the IMF to remain alongside Burundi and to support the reforms of the re-

sponsible and laborious Government. To this end, he mentioned the importance of supporting the development of human capital through the empowerment of young people and women, the improvement of the education system, the health of the population, good governance, and the fight against corruption.

His Excellency Evariste NDAY-ISHIMIYE also evokes the commitment of the State to support small businesses processing local products, the supervision of parastatal companies which were not henceforth well controlled and which worked like private companies, the support of the sector private sector in order to have access to credit, which will allow the industrialization of local products, etc. (www.presidency.bi)

Wednesday september 28, 2022, the President of the Republic His Excellency Evariste

NDAYISHIMIYE received in his office Ntare House, the Director of Operations at the World Bank Mr. Albert G.Zeufack. The Director of Operations at the World Bank Mr. Albert G. Zeufack reaffirmed the commitment of this bank to work tirelessly to support Burundi, in order to achieve inclusive economic growth. He said that this bank expresses the need to support the implementation of certain reforms undertaken by the Burundian Government, as well as the regular monitoring of projects and programs supported and financed by itself, which will make it possible to achieve the objectives of the National Development Plan.

Mr. Albert G. Zeufack reveals that the World Bank's portfolio has increased significantly over the past three years (about 1.1 billion dollars), in order to be able to accelerate the execution of economic development projects in Burundi. To this end, they exchanged on the ways and means to support in particular the areas of road infrastructure, agriculture and livestock, the environment, transport, energy, industry, ICT especially in this which is the digitization of public services, etc.

The President of the Republic, His Excellency Evariste NDAYISHIMIYE, for his part indicated that Burundi is beginning a phase of reform in all socio-economic sectors. It is high time for Burundi to acquire industries for the processing of natural resources and agricultural products that generate foreign currency. His Excellency Evariste NDAYISHIMIYE indicated that the Government of Burundi needs start-up capital to set up natural resource processing industries, given that Burundi has a lot of economic potential to recover. n tuesday september 27, 2022, in Bujumbura, opening the 1st edition of the Nigeria-Burundi Business Summit, the Head of State His Excellency Evariste NDAYISHIMIYE called on African countries to explore business opportunities for cooperation south-south.

This summit organized under the theme "Economic Development through African Private Sector Invest-

ments" saw the participation of Burundian businessmen, the Nigerian economic community living in Burundi as well as a strong delegation of Nigerian businessmen who came with the aim of strengthening bilateral cooperation through investments in the private sector and the promotion of trade. "The theme chosen for this event calls us to make ambitious commitments in order to break the status quo. Indeed, the eyes of Africans have for so long been riveted outside the continent. Few African countries have come together to develop strong and lasting investment partnerships. It is time for South-South cooperation," said the Head of State, who wished to inform the Nigerian community about the many investment opportunities offered by Burundi, added to the favorable conditions for Doing Business.

Welcoming the dynamism and creativity of the Nigerian people, the Burundian Number One suggested that Burundi, a country in the process of reconstruction, wishes to learn from the experience and expertise of Nigerians, particularly young Burundians who would like to ensure their economic empowerment. and contribute to the development of the country.

The Nigerian Ambassador to Burundi, Mr. Elijah C. Onyegba, meanwhile, said that one of the missions of the Nigerian Embassy in Burundi is to be the main embassy to connect Burundian and Nigerian businesses for the strengthening of bilateral relations. States are called upon to respect the laws and principles of the EAC Treaty

n monday september 25, 2022, the President of the Court of Justice of the East African Community (EAC) Mr Nestor Kayobera, met the heads of the superior courts of Bujumbura, the public prosecutors, the general prosecutors and executives of the central administration of the Ministry of Justice. It was a meeting of exchange and information on the organization, the functioning, the composition, the competence of the Court of Justice of the EAC and the jurisprudence within this Court.

The President of the EAC Court of Justice organized this training to show judges and magistrates that States and the General Secretariat can be brought before the Court for violations of the fundamental and operational principles provided for in the EAC Treaty. Mr Nestor

Treaty. Each natural or legal person can seize the Court without waiting for the procedures at the internal level, but the Court does not constitute an appeal for the judgments rendered by the national jurisdictions. The decisions of the EAC Court of Justice take precedence over the judgments of national courts, said Nestor Kayobera. Based on the principles of the Treaty, the jurisdiction, the functioning and the jurisprudence of the Court, Nestor Kayobera urged judicial officials to respect national laws. Similarly, the authorities of the countries are called upon to ensure that the executive, judicial and legislative bodies respect the law and the principles of the Treaty so that the States are not forced to be brought before the Court for violation of its principles. .
